### What's Next?

Now that we have finished the Habits of Healthy Churches sermon series and the cottage meetings, many are asking, what's next? Believe it or not, there is even more coming in this season than we experienced in the previous season.

After Easter you can expect a lot of activity at St. Michael as we continue this intentional process in this season of transition. Remember, the three areas of emphasis for the transition are healing, getting healthier and preparing for the next Pastor.

Here are some (but not all) of the things that you can expect after Easter:

### The Report

Perhaps the most significant thing coming is the Report of the Intentional Interim Pastor which will be comprehensive, covering a wide variety of things and will include the information gathered in the cottage meetings. There will be a congregational presentation of the report as a part of this process.

Education, Education Besides the report, the key activity of this next part of this season of transition is education. We will be providing a number of educational opportunities for the congregation to equip and empower us all. We will also continue to do specific work with our various leadership groups, including the staff, executive board and elders.

### Staffing

We are currently in the process of searching for a Worship and Discipleship Minister and are praying God will lead us to the right person sooner rather than later. We will also begin the work to start a search for a full time Children's Ministry Director.

### **Congregational Meeting**

We will have our next congregational meeting on May 5 where we will engage in the process of selecting Deacons (Executive Board Members) and make a number of changes to the constitution and bylaws. More information about the meeting, the board candidates and the bylaws will be coming ahead of the meeting.

### A Season of 'All Hands on Deck'

After the report is shared, there will be a lot of work to do to continue to get healthier and prepare for the next pastor including making key decisions, creating key policies, strengthening our ministry, clarifying our identity and much more. We need to continue to build our ministry teams and are going to need everyone to pitch it for this season and beyond.

### The Call Process

We will begin the work of the call process in this next season as well. The exact timing is still unknown as there is a lot of pre-work to do. The earliest the process would begin would be after the May congregational meeting.

Its going to be an exciting, intense, busy season of great, but hard work! We need everyone to be engaged as much as possible, with our focus on healthy engagement. As always, if you have questions, concerns or encouragement, please do not hesitate to reach out!
